Physical Development

- Show good control and co-ordination in large and small movements.

Reading

- Re-tell a narrative in correct sequence.
- Recap stories and compare different stories.
- Listen to a story and recap the features of stories.
- Read rhyming words and patterns.
- Read poems and rhyming words.
- Re-organising Dinosaur poem.
- Finding facts.

Writing

- Attempt to write dinosaur names sounding words out to help.
- Using dinosaur names experiment with sounds and words.
- Write labels.
- Write short captions.
- Plan and begin to write own story based on a story they have read.
- Plan and write a story based on a known story structure.
- Dinosaur poem couplet
- Producing a story in rhyme.

Personal, Social and Emotional Development

- Confident to speak in a familiar group, will talk about their ideas, and will choose the resources they need for their chosen activity.
