


Topic Map: Reception Term: Summer 1

Expressive Arts and Design

Literacy

Reading

- Understand the difference between fact and fiction. Read facts
- Note imp. features of information texts.
- Read instructions, note their features including bossy verbs.
- Read a familiar sentence; replace known words and read new words used.
- Read simple sentences and join using and, so or but.
- Re-read poems together & discuss how shape is related to content.
- Read in unison the rhyming words & repeated phrases in a familiar story.

Writing

- Write names of planets + Pluto, using initial letters to help.
- Shared write a list of facts acquired this wk.
- Write descriptive words and phrases.
- Suggest & write features of rockets.
- Write labels for their own rockets.
- Imagine what a character says and write speech bubbles.
- Write a description of a character using imaginative words and phrases.
- Write ideas for changes to a familiar story.
- Write simple sentences independently, join them to make a longer sentence.
- Use knowledge of spelling patterns to write rhyming words together.

Personal, Social and Emotional Development

- Confident to speak in a familiar group, will talk about their ideas, and will choose the resources they need for an activity.
- Talk about how they and others show feelings, talk about their own and others' behaviour and its consequences and know that some behaviour is unacceptable; Work as part of a group or class, and understand and follow the rules
- Show sensitivity to others' needs and feelings and form positive relationships with adults and other children.
- Work as part of a group or class, and understand and follow the rules.

Communication and Language

Speaking and listening

- Use a mnemonic to help learn planets.
- Listen and learn about features of good instructions.
- Listen to a story, make predictions and express opinions, giving reasons for preferences.
- Listen to others; speak clearly and with confidence.
- Use talk to explain feelings to others and respond to what they say.
- Listen with attention; identify the features of shape poems.
- Read poems about the Moon; discuss whether they refer to facts or myths.
