The Little Green Dinosaur



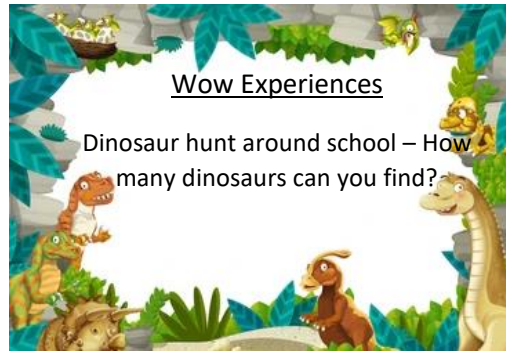
Indoor Provision

Literacy activities

- Label for the dinosaur egg – Can you write a label to protect and look after the dinosaur egg?
- Caption about a dinosaur – Can you write a fact about a dinosaur?
- Retell the story – Can you use your talk for write actions to help you to retell the story?
- Story map – Can you fill in the missing boxes to retell the story? What is missing?
- Change the story map – Change the location of where the Little Green Dinosaur hatched out of his egg.
- Write your own story – Children will all have a go at writing part of a story of their own.

Mathematics activities

- Positional Language – Where am I standing? Can you sit on, behind, next to the chair? Can you stand between the two chairs?
- Subtraction – How many are there? How many are left? How many did we subtract/take away?
- Halving – Can you fold your paper in half? Can you cut your cake in half? Can you half the numbers?
- Capacity – How much water is in this jug? Which jug holds more water? Which jug holds the least amount of water? Which jug is half full?
- Sharing – Can you share your sweets between two people? Can you share your sweets between three people?
- Measuring short periods of time – How many star jumps can you do in 10 seconds? Can we count in seconds? Can you use a stopwatch? How long does it take you to walk down the corridor?

Physical Development

Fundamentals

- Helps children to develop their ball skills through the topic of 'minibeasts'. Children will develop fundamental ball skills such as rolling and receiving a ball, throwing to a target, bouncing and catching, dribbling with feet and kicking a ball. Children will be able to develop their fine and gross motor skills through a range of game play using a variety of equipment. Children will be given opportunities to work independently and with a partner.

Yoga

Helps them to continue to develop physical, social, emotional and thinking skills. In this unit they will learn about mindfulness and body awareness. The unit builds strength, flexibility and balance.
