Wildflower Garden (Windsor Gardens)

St Matthew's will be involved in developing a community garden at an area of green space adjacent to Cherry Lane Playing Fields. Initial plans after consultation with Barry Walker from Liverpool City Council and the National Wildflower Project

for two swathes of wildflower areas at both the Cherry Lane and Queen's Drive entrance to the park would be excellent. Collaboration with Everton in the Community may lead to further structures being built such as benches, bird boxes and insect hotels. A wild flower garden would allow the area to be developed as an outdoor classroom for the children and could be used to enhance learning within Science, Art and other areas of the curriculum. We are hoping for members of all year groups to be involved in the project. We are passionate to make the project successful and we will be contacting key Councillors, local businesses and community leaders to emphasise the importance of the project and ask for their involvement and support to ensure the legacy of the project is long lasting and meaningful.






<u>Stage 3-</u> Information signage is made to help educate our pupils and the local residents about the importance of wildflowers and habitats at Windsor Gardens
