In the glorious Spring sun, Year 6 have been working hard in the build-up to our SATs but also finding time to enjoy ourselves along the way.

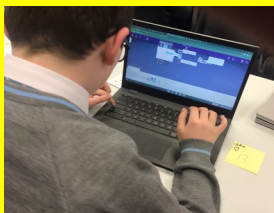
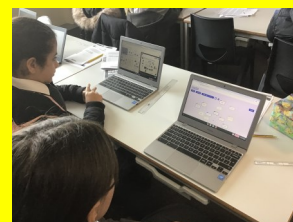
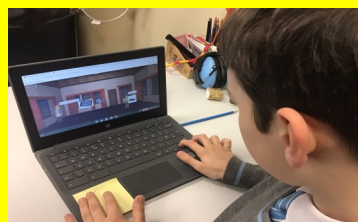


#SupportingUkraine

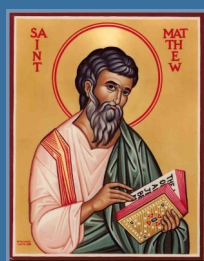
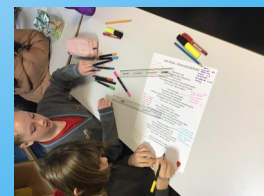
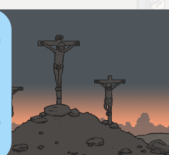


RE

In RE, we have studied 'Death and New Life'

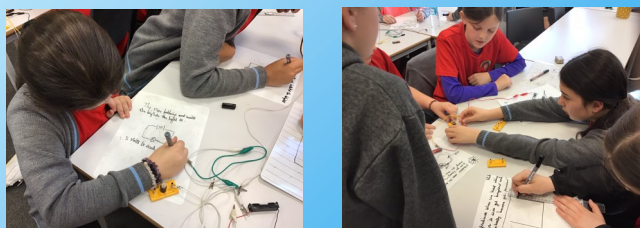
A Sad Day

We have explored the artist Alfred Morris in our 'Seaside' art topic. We analysed his work then went on to build up their art



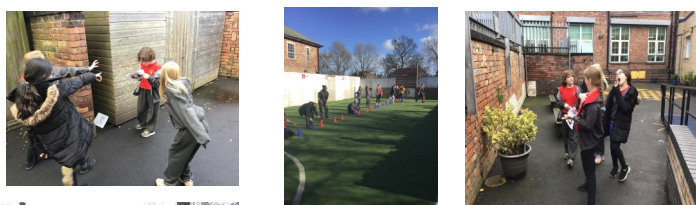
Year 6 'Power' Project
