

#### Punctuality—Be in time five to nine!

Over the past couple of weeks, we have noticed an increase in the number of children arriving to school after the gate closes at 8.55am. Gates are open from 8.40am each morning. The bell rings at 8.45am and it is from this point onwards that children can enter the school building. If your child arrives after 9.00am, when class registers close, your child will be registered at the front office and marked as late.



With the increase in numbers, children are lined up at the office for some time waiting for their turn to get their mark. Can we ask that you support us with trying to improve your child's punctuality and that they are in their own classroom for registration and the first activity of the morning.



#### **Children's University Passport**

As a school we participate in Children's University, this awards children credits for attending afterschool clubs and groups both outside and inside of school.

All the afterschool clubs the children attend in school are counted and added to their Children's university profile.
