Homework Update

Thank you to those parents who completed our homework questionnaire. Please see the results below from the questions asked:

- Does your child receive regular homework? 96.7% said YES
- Do you agree with the amount of homework given? 85.2% said YES
- Would you like your child to receive more/less homework? 52.5% said MORE
- Is your child happy whist completing their homework? 60.7% said YES
- Is your child's homework marked? 90.2% said YES
- Does your child find their homework easy/difficult/at their ability level? 72.1% said AT THEIR ABILITY LEVEL
- School has recently made changes to how the homework is delivered. Do you feel confident now with the use of seesaw? **75.4% said YES**
- Do you require any further support with the use of seesaw? 82% said NO

Similar questions were asked of the children as we also wanted to get their viewpoint on homework. The results were extremely positive, in favour of the amount of homework that is given, that it is given regularly, marked, at their ability level and just over 50% said that they actually enjoyed doing homework.

From the results of the surveys it seems that, as homework stands at the moment, there is very little that we need to change.

We will continue to use seesaw for homework and as such we will continue to offer support on the use of seesaw for those parents who wish to have it.

We have recently changed our spelling scheme. Parents will receive information on this within the next few days. Please look out for this letter as this will explain what will be happening at school and at home.

Thank you to those families and children who took the time to give their thoughts. As always, we will appreciate your feedback.



School Uniform

School uniform is important to create a sense of community, and to ensure appropriate safeguarding of all of our children. I would like to respectfully remind you that:

- Only a wristwatch (no Apple watches) and small stud ear rings to comply with health and safety guidance and safeguarding guidance are permitted.
- Hair must be of an acceptable/uniform styled and long hair must be tied back
- · No painted nails or false nails are permitted in school
- Please note: all children should be wearing school PE kits and school tracksuits if they wish do so on PE days and not different sports wear.

The school uniform policy can be found on the school website and uniform is also referenced in the safeguarding and health and safety policy if you require any further information.

A reminder that trainers should not be worn unless it is your child's PE day. We have noticed an increase in the number of children wearing Trainers and Jelly shoes, as well as jewellery and nail varnish, these are all hazards and are not allowed in school.

We have high expectations for our children to wear the correct uniform at all times.

School day from September 2023

From September 2023 primary schools are expected to offer a 32.5 hour week. This is part of the government plans, and was noted in the 'White Paper' Opportunity for all: strong schools with great teachers for your child.

The document notes this is to try to "make sure children and young people fulfil their full potential in the classroom". This equates to a six-and-a-half-hour day, Monday to Friday, the equivalent of a school being open to pupils from 8.45am to 3.15pm.

Following this guidance from September our school times will be as follows: 8:45 – 3:15pm for KS2 and 8.45 to 3.10pm for EYFS and KS1.

We are delighted to have teamed up with Everton Kids Club, who are so excited at the

prospect of working onsite at St Matthews Catholic Primary School, just a little bit about us we have 3 sites across Liverpool Our Dingle site is based onsite at Matthew Arnold Primary School in L8, Our Everton site is based onsite at Our Lady Immaculate Catholic Primary School in L5 and Our Yew Tree site is based onsite at Mab Lane Primary School L12.

Each of our sites are a home from home, friendly, fun and safe place to be. Our Children have a huge say at what we do at our clubs, this is super important to us.

We are Ofsted Registered and all of our team have an enhanced DBS and the relevant qualifications too.

We are looking to collect children onsite and provide fun and safe activities until 6pm daily, we will provide drinks and a light nutritious snack too.

The cost per session is £11.50 per first child, £10 per second Or £55.00 per Full Week. As we are Ofsted Registered universal credit may pay upto 85% of the cost, we accept childcare vouchers and tax-free childcare too.

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


As a school we define regular attendance as 97% or above.


