Year 6 SATs

Next week in school our year 6 children will be sitting their end of key stage 2 SATs tests. These tests are important assessments which will be used by the secondary schools. Our children have been preparing for these tests for a long time. At school, we know how hard and stressful this time can be for our children and families. We know our children will be amazing and try their best.

At St. Matthew's Catholic Primary School, we are constantly amazed by our incredible children, their talents, skills and personal attributes, from gymnastics, dance, music, football, singing, senses of humour, personalities, kindness and positive attitudes they impress us daily. Tests will never measure how unique, special and loved our children are. Test scores will never show the true journey of our children, they are a snapshot and show something, not everything.





School Uniform

School uniform is important to create a sense of community, and to ensure appropriate safeguarding of all of our children. I would like to respectfully remind you that:

- Only a wristwatch (no Apple watches) and small stud ear rings to comply with health and safety guidance and safeguarding guidance are permitted.
- Hair must be of an acceptable/uniform styled and long hair must be tied back
- No painted nails or false nails are permitted in school
- Please note: all children should be wearing school PE kits and school tracksuits if they wish do so on PE days and not different sports wear.

The school uniform policy can be found on the school website and uniform is also referenced in the safeguarding and health and safety policy if you require any further information.

A reminder that trainers should not be worn unless it is your child's PE day. We have noticed an increase in the number of children wearing Trainers and Jelly shoes, as well as jewellery and nail varnish, these are all hazards and are not allowed in school.

We have high expectations for our children to wear the correct uniform at all times. Please see the images below for how this should look.

We will be contacting parents individually with regards to their children if they are wearing the incorrect uniform, if you have any queries please see Ms Barnes.



If any families have any spare/used tracksuit bottoms, leggings, trousers, or any other school uniform that you can donate to the school., we would be extremely grateful. All donations can be given to the school office.

In the coming weeks we will be arranging a Swap Shop whereby parents can bring in old uniforms to exchange.

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Animals

This is just a polite reminder that no animals are to be brought onto the school site. We have had an increase in parents attempting to gain access to collect their children with their dogs and puppies, no matter if they are carried they are still not allowed on school premises.



Smoking and Vaping



Schools and colleges do not allow smoking anywhere in their grounds, this does also include the use of electronic cigarettes and disposable vapes. There have been some parents who have been politely asked by members of staff to refrain from doing this, this is a matter of the law and school's responsibility to safeguard the children in their care.

Parents and carers who continue to ignore these requests will be spoken to on an individual basis.

Whatsapp

School is aware parents regularly use Whatsapp. We would like to respectfully remind parents/carers that they need to be aware of any comments they make. Comments that are deemed offensive or slanderous are wholly unacceptable including comments about other people's children attending the school.

School expects certain standards of behaviour from everyone in their dealings with or communication about the school including our children.

These include:

- behaving reasonably;
- Not engaging in chats about other children or parents in a negative manner
- treating others with courtesy and respect
- avoiding intimidation, physical and verbal aggression at all times.

School has and will advise parents if such comments are made about their children to contact the police to report the matter.

Threadworms

A case of threadworms has been reported in school.

This information below gives you advice and information regarding threadworms.

Approximately 40% of primary school age children will get threadworms at some stage. They can easily infect the whole family. Threadworms do not cause serious damage but they are irritating and can be distressing and embarrassing for the sufferer.

What are threadworms?

They are tiny white worms about half an inch long that live in the bowel. Threadworms are spread by tiny eggs; these eggs are so small that they cannot be seen by the naked eye.

How will I know my child has threadworms?

The most common symptoms are:

- · White threads around the bottom and in faeces
- Bedwetting
- · Itchy bottom
- Disturbed sleep
- Tummy aches
- Loss of appetite
- Increased appetite

How could my child become infected?

Eggs from an infected person can stick to clothing, dust, carpets, bedding, towels etc. They can then easily be transferred to the mouth by finger sucking or nail biting.

What should I do?

Treatments can easily be obtained from your local pharmacist or GP; you can also get advice from health visitor or the school nurse. Threadworms are NOT the result of a dirty home or bad diet, there is no reason to be embarrassed. School will continue to remind the children to wash their hands regularly including before for and after the use of the toilet.

You can help prevent the spread of threadworms by:

- Washing hands and scrubbing nails before eating and after going to the toilet
- Keep fingernails short and clean
- Discourage children from scratching bottoms, biting nails, sucking fingers and picking noses.
- Wearing clean underwear everyday
- · Keeping pyjamas and bedding as clean as possible
- Bathing or showering regularly
- Vacuum carpets and rugs regularly

Can my child go to school?

Yes. But please notify us so that we can reduce the risk of infection to others.
