

## Health, safety and risk assessment in the EYFS

We believe that the health and safety of children is of paramount importance. We make our setting a safe and healthy place for children, parents, staff and volunteers by assessing and minimising the hazards and risks to enable the children to thrive in a healthy and safe environment.

The basis of this policy is risk assessment. Risk assessment processes follow the steps below:

- Identification of risk: Where is it and what is it?
- Who is at risk: Childcare staff, children, parents.
- Control measures to reduce/eliminate risk: What will you need to do, or ensure others will
  do, in order to reduce that risk?
- Monitoring and review: How do you know if what you have said is working, or is thorough enough? If it is not working, it will need to be amended, or maybe there is a better solution.

## **Procedures**

- Our risk assessment process covers adults and children and includes:
  - checking for and noting hazards and risks indoors and outside and for activities;
  - assessing the level of risk and who might be affected;
  - deciding which areas need attention and acting accordingly
  - It is the responsibility of all adults to report any concerns to a senior leader

- A daily risk assessment checklist (attached) is completed for the outdoor areas during setting up time.
- A daily risk assessment checklist (attached) is completed for the indoor areas before children arrive.
- For school trips and any off-premises activities, staff follow the whole school risk assessment procedure for trips and visits.
- In addition to these checks, staff monitor the environment throughout the day, in accordance with the 'daily general risk analysis' sheet (attached).
- Children are taught about being keeping areas safe and are actively involved in tidying up.
   Under adult supervision, they are involved in clearing potential risks such as spilt sand or milk, and making sure objects are picked up from the floor.

Check snack area, clean and ready to use?
