



How to prepare your child

Activities to try at home

- O Put coat on & do it up
- Turn clothes the right way round
- O Recognise name on clothing
- O Dress without help
- Wash hands
- O Make his/her needs known
- O Tidy toys away
- To try and write name, letters or use/hold a pencil
- O Use cutlery









Independence

- Make sure that the children can use the toilet without help
- We have spare clothes in school, in case of accidents so don't worry
- Encourage children to tell us if they have a problem
- And make sure they ask to go.....they will be allowed to go at any time

- Class rules and code of conduct for pupils and parents




Your child will be learning skills, acquiring new knowledge and demonstrating their understanding through **7 areas of learning and development**

Children should mostly develop the **3 prime areas** first. These are:

- 1. Communication and language
- 2. Physical development
- 3. Personal, social and emotional development.

As children grow, the prime areas will help them to develop skills in **4 specific areas**. These are:


- 1. Literacy;
- 2. Mathematics;
- -3. Understanding the world; and
- 4. Expressive arts and design.



How we Learn

- Teaching and learning in Reception is approached through well planned play experiences. Often the children don't even know they're working!
- Learning through practical hands on activities that are lots of fun and enjoyable but which have clear learning objectives.
- Educational visits.
- O Children will talk of both the 'indoor' and 'outdoor' classroom.





SEESAW

- Seesaw is the school's primary means of communication with families.
 - Each child and family receive a QR code at the beginning of the year to access the Seesaw app.

We post:

- what children are doing throughout the school day
- Weekly whole school newsletter
- Any other letters for trips, special events, updates etc
- All EYFS homework, curriculum updates and messages.





 You will need 2 accounts for Seesaw, a child's account and a parent's account.

All messages will be sent via parent's accounts. Parent's accounts are set up via email.

All children's work (homework) is sent via the child's account.

Children's account will be set up via a QR code sent by school.

Parents will receive emails through School Comms- please see pack for more information.


READ, WRITE INC (PHONICS)















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READ, WRITE INC (PHONICS)

What Read Write Inc. does is simple - we teach children to read and write sounds, children practice reading and spelling words containing these sounds, then we give children decodable books containing sounds and words they can read.

- They read each Storybook three times at school and again with you at home.
- On each reading, children's fluency increases and the more they can focus on what the story is about.
- Children also learn to spell the words they have been reading and develop their ideas into sentences so that they can write about the Storybooks they read.
- Alongside this we read stories to children: stories they cannot yet read for themselves

Home Learning

After the first full week in school, parents will be sent an overview of topics that the children are learning via Seesaw. This will support the skills that the children will be developing in school.

Homework will vary but include;

- Q Links to phonics activities.
- Reading for Reading Records/ Read Write appropriate.
- Maths, RE and topic homework.
- O Homework is sent out each half term. We provide a list of suggested activities. At this age, homework can be done through less formal methods e.g talking, reading or researching about the new topics.

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Reading Books and Phonics Pack

- O Children will start off sound blending book and phonics pack. Once they are able to blend and segment, they will be given a reading book.
- O You will be given a diary to record comments in, when you share/read a book with your child.
- O Along with their Phonics pack, it must be brought to school every day.
- O Please do not put water bottles in with your child's sharing/reading book.



Universal free school meals (PP)



Every student. Every meal. Every school.

- O All children in EYFS and Key Stage 1 (Reception to year 2) are entitled to universal free school meals as part of government funding.
- O Please note school can obtain additional funding which can benefit your children called Pupil Premium depending if you are receipt of certain benefits
- We use this funding to provide a wide variety of additional opportunities for our children
- School office staff happy to talk to anyone who needs any further information
 there is a leaflet in your pack that explains this in more detail.

Healthy School Lunches

- Our caterers are fantastic! Will deal with any allergies and meet with concerned parents.
- All Reception children will be expected to stay for school dinners (no lunches to be brought in from home but please don't worry if you have a fussy eater – we will cater for them)
- Lunch options: Different hot choice daily, jacket potatoes, pasta, salad, sandwiches/wraps, snacks and deserts.
- Snack and milk during morning session
- Water bottles from home/water is always available
- Additional snack (cereal, fruit etc)

-Small contribution for snack per term payable via parent pay





Breakfast Club

- See extended services policy
- Maximum 75 places
- Starts at 7.45am
- £3 per day
- Application form in pack if full waiting list
- Food options
- Provision games / activities
- Pay from September to June on parent pay form in pack.
 We ask for payments 1 month in advance.



After School Wrap Around Care



- St Matthew's run a high quality, Ofsted registered after school provision until
 6.00pm every day (St Matthew's Afterschool)
- All staff are fully qualified and are trained in first aid and safeguarding and DBS
- The club aims to work with the children to provide a planned range of activities that will meet the needs of all of the children attending. There will be opportunities for indoor and outdoor play, relaxation and quiet areas, ICT opportunities and work areas where the children can begin homework if desired by the child

- O No medicines can be administered by staff. Children with asthma will be helped to take their inhaler.
- First aid lots of bumps in Reception (don't worry this is normal)
- Medical concerns must be shared!


